TUESDAY EVENING BASIC WATERMEDIA FOR TEENS & ADULTS**Sandra Grimland**

Sandra Grimland's acrylic and mixed media paintings on display at The Upstairs Gallery reveal her humor, her strong sense of composition, and her love of color. This class is perfect for working people and for students wanting to develop their skills in painting.

SUPPLIES: If you already have acrylics, bring what you have. Here is a suggested kit:

Palette: 11" x 15" porcelain or 11"x 14" paper

Paper - 140 lb full sheet (to be divided in class). Illustration board 11" x 14." Canvas 11" x 14."

Brushes: Round soft #4 & #6; flat soft 1" & 1.5" Filbert soft #10 & #12. Bristle round: #4 & #6.

Bristle flat #4, #6, #8, & #10.

Tubes of Liquitex acrylic: Cadmium red light, cadmium red medium, alizarin Crimson permanent, cadmium yellow dark, cadmium yellow medium cadmium yellow light, cadmium orange, brilliant yellow green, sap green permanent, cobalt teal, cobalt blue, ultramarine blue, brilliant purple, yellow ochre, raw sienna, burnt sienna, raw umber, burnt umber, mars black, titanium white, and unbleached titanium.

Masking (beige) tape 1", Kleenex, paper towels, spray bottle, isopropyl alcohol.

Have fun painting with watercolor on paper a variety of subject matter. Beginners should enroll in the Watercolor for Beginners with Sam Hopkins.

Colors: Liquitex acrylics Winsor Newton or Gamblin Artist oil paints in these colors: burnt sienna, burnt umber, cadmium orange, cadmium red deep, cadmium yellow deep, cobalt blue, Indian yellow, raw sienna, sap green, ultramarine blue, dioxazine purple, and zinc white.

Brushes: #10, #6. #4. Sable brush flat #6.

Oil painters need a palette, Linseed oil, odorless Turpenoid, palette, paper towels, Goop hand cleaner, container for brush cleaner, table top easel.

Acrylic painters need a paper palette, paper towels, and a table top easel.

OIL PAINTING WORKSHOP**Judy Gelfert**

Judy grew up on her family's ranch in Bowie. After graduating from UT, where she studied, history, German, and painting, she became a flight attendant. Between flights, she sketched paintings in the world's great museums and on her days off experimented with oils. Since she began showing her work in 2002, she has received such honors 1st Place in a National Society of Artists' Juried Competition and acceptances in The Oil Painters of America National Juried Competitions. She's currently represented by Marta Stafford Fine Art in Marble Falls, Texas, The Good Art Company in Fredericksburg, Texas, and The Upstairs Gallery.

This workshop is for beginning and advanced painters alike. Judy will offer insight on how to achieve dramatic light effects in painting, as well as how to express energy or calmness in a painting. Though she will focus on painting in oils, those wanting to use acrylics are welcome, but should bring some extender to slow the drying time.

Oil paints: naphthol red or Grumbacher Red (This is the opaque red Judy prefers. If you can't find it, bring cadmium red light); alizarin crimson; burnt Sienna; ultramarine blue; Prussian blue; cadmium yellow light; yellow ochre; cadmium orange; sap green; titanium white.

Brushes: #8, #10, and #12 bright bristle (not synthetic), #2 round bristle (for sketching) Judy prefers Lexington II brushes by Windsor and Newton.

Primed canvases or prepared boards: 16 x 20 or smaller.

Additional Supplies Palette (disposable is fine). Palette knife. Jar with odorless paint thinner, mineral spirits, turpenoid, or turpenoid natural.

Paper towels. Optional: baby wipes (these are great hand cleaners!).

Wear old clothes or an apron.

Reference material: photos (preferably rather simple scenes with lots of light and shadow.

Also, Judy prefers that you bring original photographs taken by you or someone you know.)

MONDAY EXPERIMENTAL WORKSHOPS

Karen Foster

Karen Foster is offering her popular experimental workshops here at the gallery studio. Each month she will help you explore the creative possibilities of various techniques and materials.

TIME: 9:30 a.m.-4:00 p.m.

FEE: \$45 per class

AGES: 13 to adult

June 15: DRIP PAINTING: Unlike Jackson Pollock, who worked mostly horizontally, Karen will show you how to use a vertical surface to encourage dripped paint to make its way to the bottom and then how to finish with negative painting.

Supplies: 16"x 20" canvas or board, acrylic paints of any kind, an easel, a couple of wide brushes and few medium sized brushes, paper towels, lunch money or sack lunch.

July 20: TREES WITH ATTITUDE: Trees are as unique as people, each having their own personality. Use texture, color, and contrast to create your own individual tree.

Supplies: acrylic paints and brushes, tissue paper, gel medium, stencils, chop stick or any texture making tools, palette knife, canvas or canvas board no larger than 16" x 20", lunch money or sack lunch.

Aug. 17: MAP ART: Learn to incorporate maps and paints into all kinds of artwork. **Supplies:** bring any maps of any kind if you have some or there will be maps available if not. A gloss or matte medium, a brush designated for glue, paper towels, a canvas or board no larger than 16" x 20", transparent acrylic paints and brushes, scissors, tracing paper, lunch money or sack lunch.

Sep. 21: NATGEO CITRASOLVE: Let Karen guide you through the process of transforming *National Geographic* magazines into pages of beautiful surprises. These pages will be used in this class as a basis for your painting.

Supplies: Bring a *National Geographic* magazine, year 1993 or newer, acrylic paints and brushes, matte medium and wide brush, paper towels, 8oz. bottle of *Citrasolve* concentrated cleaner available at Jerry's Artarama, Dickblick, Cheap Joes, some Albertsons, some Whole Foods and some Sprouts or I will have some for you to purchase, Lunch money or sack lunch.

Oct. 19: COLLAGE: Karen will show you how to use a cache of papers to create beautiful compositions.

Supplies: 12" x16" or 11" x14" canvas or board, matte medium and a brush for glue, paper towels or baby wipes, any paper ephemera such as magazines, commercially printed paper, or handmade papers, acrylic paints and brushes. Lunch money or sack lunch.
